Issuance of this RFQ in no way obligates DAI to award a subcontract or purchase order and bidders will not be reimbursed for any costs associated with the preparation of their bid Government Withholding Tax for Afghan Based Companies Pursuant to Article 72 in the Afghanistan Tax Law, effective March 21, 2009, DAI is required to withhold "contractor" taxes from the gross amounts payable to all Afghan for-profit subcontractors/vendors. In accordance with this requirement, DAI shall withhold two percent (2%) tax from all gross invoices to Afghan subcontractors/vendors under this Agreement with active AISA or Ministry of Commerce license. For subcontractors/vendors without an active AISA or Ministry of Commerce license, DAI shall withhold seven percent (7%) "Contractor" taxes per current Afghanistan Tax Law. A Total of 80/80 Mbps DL/UL Dedicated WiMAX Internet Connections for AVCP Kabul, Kandahar, Jalalabad, Mazar, and Herat Offices.

Technical Speciation/Requirement:

1. The bandwidth must be dedicated 1:1 ratio
2. Packet loss should not be greater than 5%
3. The ISP should guarantee 99.9% up time connection
4. The ISP should provide /29 subnet per site that should include 5 Public, white-listed and routable IP addresses
5. Public IP addresses must NOT be NAT-ed and Link should not be filtered by any firewall applications or proxy. DAI will be running VPN IPsec links, VOIP and MAIL system along with web browsing, Skype, IM, webmail etc.
6. The ISP should Provide DNS servers
7. DAI will provide Firewall/Router with Fast Ethernet connection interface. Please include equipment capable of delivering link to our firewall.
8. The equipment should be provided on free lease basis
9. ISP should provide telephone numbers of technical engineers for 24/7 technical support.
10. Unreachable or busy technical support lines lasting more than 1 hour in any given month, or failure of ISP to respond to messages within 1 hour, may be considered a failure to comply with the technical requirements of the contract. 5. The ISP should notify AVCP of any changes / deployment and provide details of the problem and their proposed solution in case maintenance or any technical issues occurred to AVCP 's internet connection.
6. ISP should provide TOP level ISP detailed information and internet traffic routing information: DAI traffic cannot be routed at any level through Iran or Iranian Internet Service Providers.
7. ISP must provide internet from two different networks (Asia or Europe) for redundancy.
8. ISP must install a Ka-Band VSAT limit service (120 GB) monthly for Kabul Office for backup link.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR OBTAINING AN Unique Entity ID (SAM)

Note: There is a Mandatory Requirement for your Organization to Provide an Unique Entity ID (SAM) to DAI

I. SUBCONTRACTS/PURCHASE ORDERS: All domestic and foreign organizations which receive first-tier subcontracts/ purchase orders with a value of \$30,000 and above are required to obtain an Unique Entity ID (SAM) prior to signing of the agreement. *Your organization is exempt from this requirement if the gross income received from all sources in the previous tax year was under \$300,000. II. The Unique Entity ID (SAM) is a 12-character alphanumeric value managed, granted, and owned by the government. This allows the government to streamline the entity identification and validation process, making it easier and less burdensome for entities to do business with the federal government.

Entities are assigned an identifier during registration, or one can be requested at SAM.gov without needing to register. Ernst and Young provides the validation services for the U.S. Government. The information required for getting an Unique Entity ID (SAM) without registration is minimal. It only validates your organization's legal business name and address. It is a verification that your organization is what you say it is.


The Unique Entity ID (SAM) does not expire.

THE PROCESS FOR OBTAINING AN UNIQUE ENTITY ID IS OUTLINED BELOW:

1. Have the following information ready to request an Unique Entity ID (SAM)
 - a. Legal Business Name
 - b. Physical Address (including ZIP + 4)

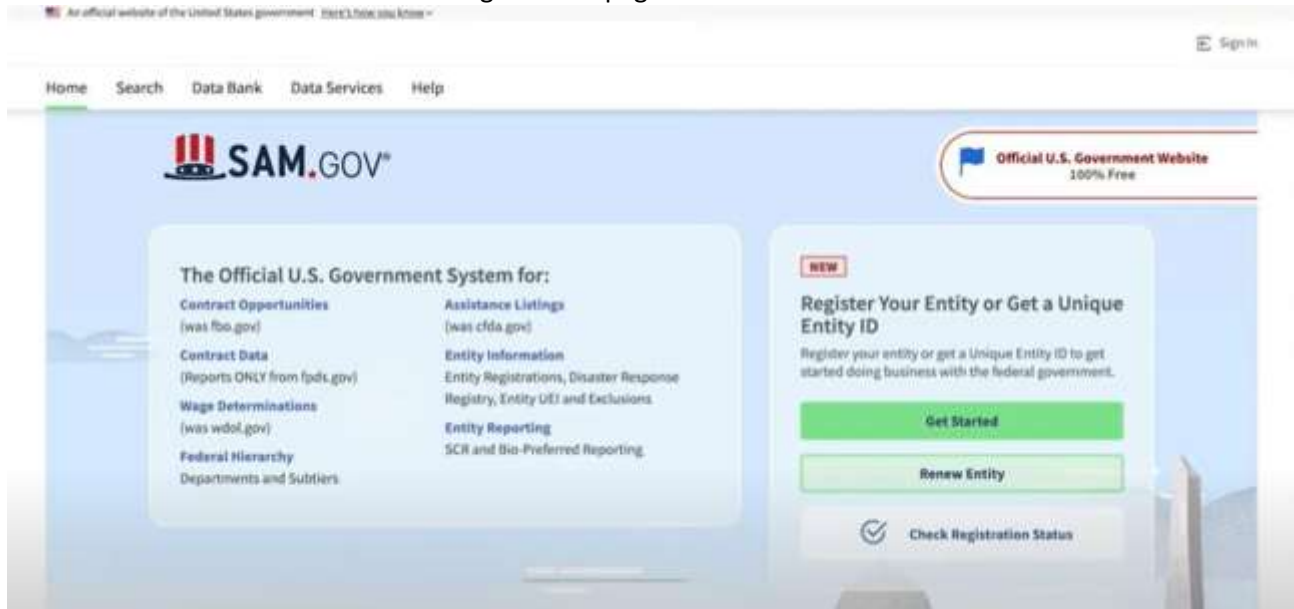

 - a. Create an Individual User Account to perform tasks such as register/update your entity, create and manage exclusion records or to view FOUO level data for entity records.
 - b. Create a System User Account if you need system-to-system communication or if performing data transfer from SAM to your government database system. Complete the requested information, and then click "Submit."
4. Click "DONE" on the confirmation page. You will receive an email confirming you have created a user account in SAM.

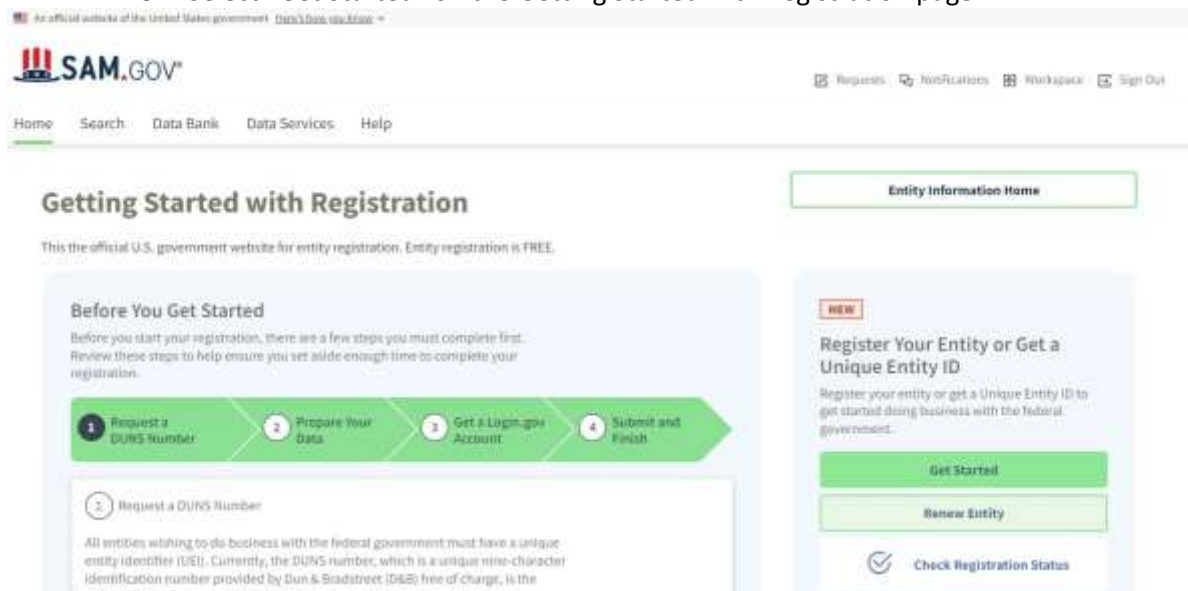

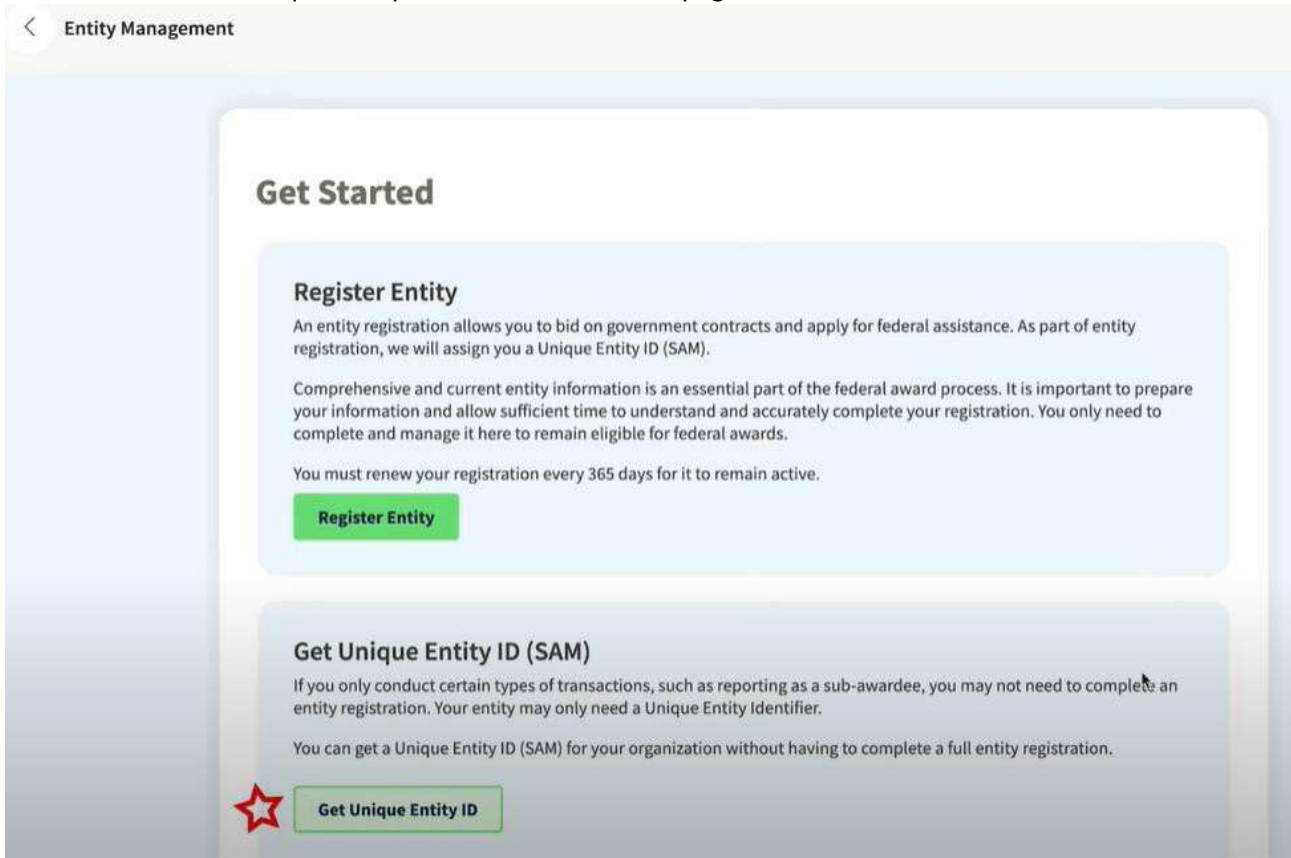
